- **Summer Camp**

Tall Pine Council Annual Health and Medical Record Form for summer camp

If you are going to summer camp this year you will need to complete a new Annual Health and Medical Information Form. I have several copies or you may download it from the Troop Web-Page, www.troop219.org, under Downloadable Forms. You need to attach a copy of your immunization record or enter the complete dates of all shots in the appropriate section. We will need a copy of your Health Insurance Card and adults do need a current (negative) TB Tine Test. Your physical exam must have been completed after July 11, 2006 for Scouts and adults under the age of forty. Adults forty years old or older require a physical annually, after July 11, 2008. Next year everyone will need to have a physical within 12 months of the event or activity.

Summer Camp Equipment and Bike w/Helmet Drop-Off

Since a number of families may want to do something on Friday and Saturday, July 3 and 4, we have schedule the equipment drop off for Wednesday, July 1 and Thursday, July 2, 2009, from 6:30 P.M. until 8:30 P.M. Bikes and helmets should also be dropped off when you drop off your equipment. If you are going to be out of town make arrangements with someone to drop off the stuff for you. Or contact me to make arrangements for an earlier drop off time and date.
